

A reflection from the Pastor

So Jesus said again, "Amen, amen, I say to you, I am the gate for the sheep," today's gospel=good news.

This Sunday, traditionally called Good Shepherd Sunday invites us to reflect on hearing Jesus' call to himself. Indeed, there are so many voices in the world today. Many will try to tell us that they are the way; voices like drugs, alcohol, addictions; but they are only deceptions that make us into slaves of themselves. True, to follow Jesus means to become a slave for all, but the reward is everlasting life.

Just this past week I had someone new in my office. He was asking a lot of questions. And he finally asked me, is this a Roman Catholic Church, and are you a priest? I suppose the big white church and sign out front and my collar were not enough, so I said yes. But the reason he asked was because I was inviting him to consider that the Church is that of Jesus Christ, the modern title of defining the Catholic Church by Rome is one that is not used in official language. Official documents of the Church, like *Lumen Gentium*, the Dogmatic Constitution on the Church, promulgated in 1964 by His Holiness Pope Paul VI, is replete with this reality – we are the Catholic Church in Jesus Christ who draws us and is the light of nations.

Yes, it is another technical point, but it is a reminder that sometimes what we think and say, is not something we have taken time to dissect and make a part of who we are. St. Peter in the Acts of the Apostles today, stands up and raises his voice at the eleven, and says lets get this straight whom we belong to. Was he reacting out of the fact that they were doing their own thing? Possibly. But in every age, people have made their response to God's call. In our age, Christ is the light of our faith. He is the one calling us through himself to the Father.

Try this week, to take some time and meditate on what we believe – particularly the part of the creed that refers to Jesus the Christ. If you need to, define the words on a piece of paper, or pull up the Catechism on line. It is only in this way that we will begin to know who Jesus is and whom we are following: The Good Shepherd.

Prayer for the Holy Father

Lord, source of eternal life and truth, give to your shepherd, Pope Benedict, a spirit of courage and right judgment, a spirit of knowledge and love.

By governing with fidelity, those entrusted to his care, may he, as successor to the apostle Peter and Vicar of Christ, build your Church into a sacrament of unity, love, and peace for all the world. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. Amen.

Pray also for Bishop Fellhauer who will travel to Washington to visit the Holy Father.

This is the Holy Father's first visit to the United States. He will arrive on Tuesday, April 15 and stay at the Vatican Embassy. On His 80th birthday, April 16th, he will visit the White House and President and Mrs. Bush. He will also meet with the U.S. Bishops. Thursday, April 17, he will celebrate Mass at Nationals Stadium and give an address at The Catholic University of America. Friday the 18th, the Pope will address the United Nations and attend an ecumenical meeting. Saturday the 19th, he will have Mass at St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York. Sunday, April 20 he will visit Ground Zero and have Mass at Yankee Stadium. He will return to Vatican City on April 21.
