

A reflection from the Pastor

Jesus took Peter, James, and John his brother and led them up a high mountain by themselves. And he was transfigured before them; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light. We hear this account of Jesus Transfiguration this Second Sunday of Lent.

By now the ashes have cooled and gone from our foreheads, we have probably calmed down and realized it is Lent, and hopefully we have immersed ourselves in the practices of the seasons; fasting, prayer, penance, and works of charity. The account of the Transfiguration comes at a time in which we are hopefully progressing toward our own changes in terms of spiritual growth.

Jesus' transfiguration took place to show his nature as God and to lead the disciples into a deeper belief, before Jesus' death and resurrection. When we allow the light of God's grace to touch us, we too reveal, even if it be in small glimpses, the glory which is to come.

Pray this week that you might go deeper into the work of Lent and take some time to think about how God is changing you and transfiguring you into the image of his glory.
