

A reflection from the Pastor

"This is my body ... this is my blood," Jesus in today's gospel, this Body and Blood of Christ Sunday. How often we hear these words, and how often we consume Jesus. But how often are we consumed by Jesus? Do we allow his Body and Blood to fill ourselves and heal the most inner recesses of our lives? As Catholics, the Eucharist, the Body and Blood of Christ, is the center of our Faith. To some outside of communion with the Roman Church in union with the Pope, they believe that a symbolic reception of bread and wine is fine once in a while – and the leftovers are simply put in the trash receptacle. Not so with us. We reverence the Body and Blood of Christ, and any fragments reserved in the Tabernacle are meant for either (1) homebound communion to the sick and dying or (2) for adoration, even if not exposed. When we pass the Church do we allow His presence to consume us? After communion do we pray that we will be consumed by his love and seek reconciliation with others? This is what we must work toward in our love for the Eucharist. As you hear those words in Mass, let your 'Amen' be a 'Yes' to be consumed.

The Holy Father has named this upcoming year, June 19, 2009 through June 11, 2010 the 'Year for Priests.' It is a time to reflect on the meaning and dignity of the priesthood and help ordained priests to dedicated themselves to service of the Church. Please stay tuned for further information and activities pertaining to this year.

I know that many of you are traveling and taking it easy during the summer. Please be safe if traveling, and be sure to watch out for sun exposure during these hot days. I have modified the daily Mass schedule for the summer to Wednesday and Friday mornings at 8:00 a.m. as per the calendar.
