

**A reflection from the Pastor**

"... love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your being, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself," Jesus telling the scholar of the law what he must do to inherit eternal life. This answer by Jesus seems so simple and yet in practice it is difficult when we do not give ourselves over to His grace and mercy. Pray this week that this will be your way of living.

As you know, the bishop has relieved me of my pastoral duties here at St. Patrick's and appointed me pastor of Our Lady of the Gulf in Port Lavaca, and her three missions in Point Comfort, Seadrift, and Port O'Connor. The new assignment will take effect July 14, 2010, at which time the new pastor of St. Patrick's will assume his pastoral responsibilities. The new pastor is the Reverend Samuel Appiasi, current parochial administrator of St. Peter in Blessing and its mission of St. Robert in Markham. Fr. Samuel has been a pastor there for ten years. He will best be able to tell you of his past assignments and life history when he arrives.

I thank you for your many prayers and well wishes over these past four years. It is difficult to believe they have gone by so fast, the time seems so short. Nonetheless, I have been so blessed by being here, my first pastoral assignment, and your tenth pastor. As I wrote for the fiftieth anniversary, where will we be in twenty-five years or five years, we don't know, but we know that we must never shrink from doing the work of proclaiming the Kingdom of God and the salvation won for us by Christ Jesus our Lord. That is the true work of a parish. I ask for your continued prayers as I assume this new responsibility in Port Lavaca. Be assured of my prayers for you.
