



A reflection from the Pastor

Repent is a word that is mentioned a lot in the bible and in our Christian life – and in today's gospel. What does it mean to repent? Most commonly, repent means to turn away from sin and rededicate one's life to change. It can also mean, and probably the most felt response, to feel sorrow or regret, so much so as to change one's mind. When we repent of doing some wrong, we first realize that it was wrong and then we feel sorrow and regret for having done it, and that then leads us to some form of reconciliation. Repentance is not in itself forgiveness. It is the act that opens us up to forgiveness. The ultimate form of reconciliation is with Christ in the sacrament of Penance; but it also requires that we make those sins right with those we have offended. Repentance is real work, the Greek word in the New Testament for repentance is *metanoia* – to literally change one's mind and to realize that it is God who gives us the gift of forgiveness through Jesus' cross and resurrection. So, this third week of Lent, think about that which you need true repentance of – I invite you to reread the story of the prodigal son, Luke 15:11 ff., which is an exemplary parable of repentance. Then let the light of God's grace help to make any

Diocesan Services Appeal 2010

By now you have received at your homes the pledge cards from the diocese regarding the 2010 Diocesan Services Appeal. The monies collected go toward the programs and services, salaries and operational expenses of the Chancery of the Bishop, which this year will total \$1,349,808. Each parish in the diocese has a goal for each year, which is calculated by averaging three years of parish collections (first). **This year the goal for St. Patrick's is \$21,170.** This is up \$2,434.93 from last year which was \$18,735.07. I encourage you to give. Any money given will offset the amount the parish owes at the end of the year. Last year, individual contributions totaled \$1,255.00. May God bless you in your generosity.

Weekday Gospel Excerpts for Reflection

Monday - "They rose up, drove him out of the town, and led him to the brow of the hill on which their town had been built, to hurl him down headlong. But he passed through the midst of them and went away." Luke 4:29-30

Tuesday - "Peter approached Jesus and asked him, "Lord, if my brother sins against me, how often must I forgive him? As many as seven times?" Jesus answered, "I say to you, not seven times but seventy-seven times." Matthew 18:21-22

Wednesday- "Therefore, whoever breaks one of the least of these commandments and teaches others to do so will be called least in the Kingdom of heaven." Matthew 5:19

Thursday - "Whoever is not with me is against me, and whoever does not gather with me scatters." Luke 11:23
