Peace. "If you do not repent, you will all perish as they did..." Jesus in today's gospel. Quite strong language coming from our Lord, but there is in him no ambiguity. We often couch ourselves in thought and language - oh, he'll forgive us anyway, or he couldn't possibly let us be damned - as we continue to sin. Yet, the reality of TRUTH, that is God, is that His word is the real thing. Therefore we should take to heart what he says - we must repent. How and what does this mean. It means looking sincerely at past and present actions that go against his law of love - of Him and neighbor - and our first, acknowledging the misdeed, then asking for forgiveness and finally trying not to do it again. Real repentance takes work. Let us pray in this week that we might know what we need to repent of and then let us do it.

Please be mindful of the times for Reconciliation. Don't all try to go at once. Again, I encourage you to bring your family for the stations of the cross each Friday evening. If you would like to come and pray during the day, they are printed in both languages beginning on page 244 of the missalette.

As you may know, the Parish Hall and Heritage Room floors were stripped of all old wax and grime and waxed - and look wonderful. This two day event (Thursday and Friday) really makes it a place of welcome. Thank you to all who helped move the furniture. 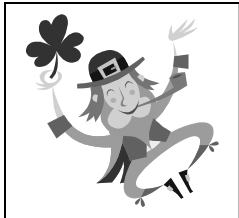
