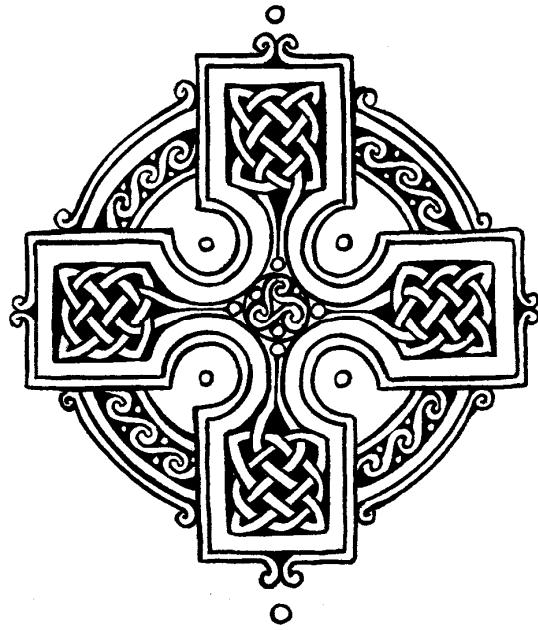


St. Patrick's Catholic Church

A reflection from the Pastor

Peace.

Today's gospel presents us with the scene of Martha and Mary and Jesus. Mary was busy listening to Jesus and his message. Martha was busy preparing everything for the meal. Martha in her haste sees Mary at the feet (not working) and asks Jesus to tell her to help. But Jesus tells Martha not to get over anxious, Mary has chosen the better part, and it will not be taken from her.

As we sit with this scene, we can not help but feel sorry for Martha. Indeed, most of our adult, if not Christian life, is spent laboring and preparing. But Jesus is saying that is still part of the work - but the choice of Mary is essential to life - listening to what the Lord has to say. And so, as it is in all of life, we must strike the proper balance. Too little sleep, makes us unproductive and cranky, too much sleep makes us want even more.

Try this week to see what is in need of balance in your journey of faith. How can you make more time to listen to the Lord. Make that time. As you will notice in the bulletin today, I have outlined the major ways we will be called to serve the parish in my second year as pastor. Take the time to sit at the feet of the Lord and see what he might be inviting you to do. You may at first react out of your talents, but he may want to stretch you to work out of his love. Give it time and keep posted to the bulletin.

On this same theme, you will notice that I have published hours for the church grounds. They will be open from sunrise to sunset unless there is a scheduled activity. Over the past year I have had to endure the constant unrest of people being around the house at all hours. Recently, in the last six months, the numbers of peoples walking/jogging/talking has increased from the hours of 10:00 p.m. to Midnight by a couple of dozen at times. I have also had several instances of abuse of the property and non-obeying of my requests. That is uncalled for. We are not a public property. This is private property of the Church, and my residence. It should be respected by all, just as one would want their own residence respected. And so I decided, that because it is my residence, I have to make rules that will allow me to relax and hear the voice of the Lord. Please pass the times on to those you know.
