

A reflection from the Pastor

Peace. Ambition, desire, or both? James and John certainly had a lot of nerve, asking Jesus to secure them a place, one at his right and one at his left in the kingdom. We have to remember that they were also two of the three (the other being Peter) who witnessed Jesus' transfiguration – and it was then that they wanted to erect booths for Jesus, Moses, and Elijah. Was it ambition or was it just blind desire, or both?

What is clear is Jesus' answer – it was not for him to give. It was up to the Father. And so that brings us to a new question – what are we working toward? At times it may seem that we are getting close to Jesus just to get the seat of honor like James and John, but in reality we draw close to Jesus to grow in our relationship with the Father, so that he may in due time lift us up. Jesus says the only ambition we should have is to serve, and that means even those we don't want to; even those that are ambitious and self-seeking. Let us pray in this week that we might not ask for ourselves alone, but to seek and serve the Lord and grow in our love of the Father.
