

A reflection from the Pastor

Peace. Today's gospel is definitely good news for those who believe in Jesus. Jesus responded to those who questioned where he came from by showing his authority and power. The good news is just this: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world."

That is at the heart of what we believe as Catholic Christians. From my own experience, if you ask young children: "Who wants to die?" not many hands go up. But if you ask: "Who wants to live for ever?", every hand, right and left, goes sky high. Our faith teaches us that to be a follower of Jesus means to stay in communion with him. We believe that he is truly present, Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity in the Eucharist we receive. This is how we remain assured of His promise – to eat as he commanded us.

If you find yourself in a situation that prevents you from communion, make it a real aim to speak to me about getting back in communion. The Lord is calling you and he wants you to be with him forever. Jesus is saying, stop murmuring to yourselves, and return to Him.

Let us pray in this week that we might be imitators of this good news.

On an administrative note: each month I will prepare a financial statement for you to see where we are going in terms of our financial standing. This will be the most basic income and expenditure statement, so that we can keep track.
