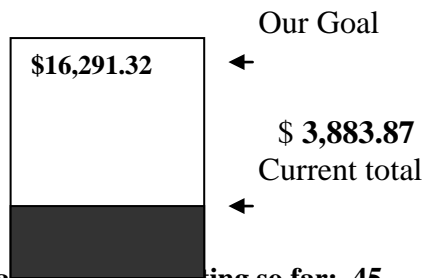

**Fall Scripture Class**  
*Understanding the Bible*

The fall scripture series began with our comprehensive look at the bible. We have looked at various books of the bible in terms of their author, date written, and a summary of important information.

This past Tuesday we looked at the book of the Prophet Jeremiah. We concluded by looking at women prophetesses of the bible.

This week is the last class DECEMBER 4, 2007 in the Heritage Room, from 7:00 until 8:15 p.m.

All adults are invited to attend. Religious Education teachers are strongly encouraged to attend. If you don't have a bible, one will be furnished.

Some Notes from the Last Class

Jeremiah (name means "The Lord raises up")

Born 650 B.C. of a priestly family from near Jerusalem and called as a youth to prophesy. He remained among ruins of Jerusalem, but later forced into Egyptian exile – and murdered there by his own countrymen

More than the other prophets, Jeremiah seems to be a type and model of Jesus the Christ. For example:

1. They were both confirmed from womb of mother  
Jer 1.5 Luke 1.26-38
2. Both Unmarried  
Jer 16ff.
3. They were both hounded by hometown and family  
Jer. 12.6 Luke 4.24-29
4. Both wept over Jerusalem  
Jer. 8.23 Luke 19.41
5. Both spoke of temple as den of thieves  
Jer. 7.11 Matthew 21.13
6. Both consulted secretly/fearfully  
Jer 37.17 John 3.1ff
7. Both foresaw a new covenant  
Jer 31.31 -34 (written on heart/not stone)  
Luke 22.20 (cup of His blood = covenant)

*About the Jesse Tree:* this custom from the Middle Ages comes from the words: 'A shoot shall come up from the stump of Jesse, and from his roots a branch will bear fruit' (Isaiah 11. 1). Jesse was the father of King David and the Bible tells us that Jesus will be born 'of the house of David'. By going back to David's father, Jesse, the Jesse Tree can be thought of as Jesus' family tree.

Each day of advent a new symbol will be added to the tree beginning Dec. 2. I will be putting the weekly scripture

### Parish Ministries

Back in July, I inserted a flyer asking you to consider giving of yourself to various ministries in the parish. Advent is here and now is the time to begin implementing these ministries. Please sign up for the ministry you feel the Lord calling you to serve the parish. Sign up sheets are posted in the narthex (gathering space). Once the list is complete we will organize a date for a meeting. Thank you and may God continue to bless our work in his name.

#### \_\_\_\_ Lector

The lector reads from the ambo the readings that precede the Gospel. If there is no psalmist, the lector may also proclaim the responsorial Psalm after the first reading. When no deacon is present, the lector, after the introduction by the priest, may announce from the ambo the intentions of the Prayer of the Faithful.

#### \_\_\_\_ Altar Server

The altar server assists the priest and the faithful in the celebration of the Holy Mass.

#### \_\_\_\_ Homebound/Bereavement

This ministry seeks to bring the Sacraments and the news of God's love to those who are homebound for whatever reason; illness, age, etc. It also helps those who have recently lost a loved one.

#### \_\_\_\_ Nursing Home

This ministry is one that seeks the homebound, but those from our parish who are presently in elderly care facilities.

#### \_\_\_\_ Hospitality

To welcome visitors to our parish. To provide social gatherings and after-Mass opportunities for fellowship and food. Church greeters. First Sunday gatherings w/coffee and donuts after each Mass, etc.

#### \_\_\_\_ Vocations

To encourage and support vocations to the priesthood and religious life. To foster prayer and teaching for families to encourage vocations. To implement ideas to promote vocations. Suggested: Traveling Family Statue monthly for vocation prayer. Prayer services, luncheons, speakers, etc.

#### \_\_\_\_ Archives/History

In my estimation, each parish should have an archival team. This team will play an important role in chronicling the parish life and recording and preserving it. To archive the records of the parish and preserve important documents, pictures, etc. To be preparing for our fiftieth anniversary in 2010.

#### \_\_\_\_ Marriage Sponsor Couple

To encourage and support the vocation of marriage for those couples preparing. Monthly talks to couples preparing for marriage, other ideas as discussed with pastor.
