Peace. Vigilance. We often experience keeping vigil at wake services for those to be buried, a time of sleeplessness and watching or observing. The ultimate vigil is the Easter Vigil, in which we keep watch for the Resurrection of Jesus, the Christ, from the dead. Today's gospel invites us to keep vigil, not just once a year, but daily, hourly, indeed at every moment. How do you keep vigil for the Lord? Do we eagerly anticipate his return, as if we are ready for the wedding feast? We keep vigil by making certain we have articles of faith handy; a crucifix, the bible, blessed candles to serve as light in the darkness, holy water, and the image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Indeed we have to be able to know for whom we are looking. If you don't have a designated space for these items in your home, make room for them and keep vigil by praying and using them.
