

A reflection from the Pastor
"The person who is trustworthy in very small matters is also trustworthy in great ones; and the person who is dishonest in very small matters is also dishonest in great ones," Jesus in today's gospel. Trust is something that we cherish and once it has been broken, it is difficult to regain. This is why Jesus says, when you mean yes, say "yes" and when you mean no, say "no." Each decision we make establishes our trust, not only with others but with our God. Therefore, we need to make good choices. Try this week to take the time to make good choices. You will find that more will find you trustworthy, as the gospel says. The moment we allow ourselves to be dishonest, we open ourselves up for a life of dishonesty and the reaching out to regain trust.
