"Come see a man who told me everything I have done", the woman with water jar in today's gospel speaking of Jesus.

As we move closer to the great feast of Easter, and the renewal of our baptismal promises, the readings today focus on water. We know that if we go for a long period without water we get extremely thirsty. The same is true with our faith life. If we are consistently drawing from the well of faith in Jesus the Christ, then we remain satiated. But when we stray and go for periods without Him, we thirst for Him; in the Sacraments and in the Church, one another. The ebb and flow of life, as us to keep up with thirst, the ebb and flow of Christianity asks us to be consistent with our faith. Can you imagine if you only drank water once a month? That's what it's like when some choose not to go to Mass for a month or more at a time. Faith becomes something of a 'extra' curricular activity. Something added to what we think we are doing right. If you know someone who operates in these circles, invite them back. Lent is a great time for return and reconciliation. The same is true for the Sacrament of Penance. Even with extra hours during Lent, few have responded. Don't let your faith go dry. As an aid, I have printed an examine of conscience in this bulletin, please take some time to make a good one before the great Feast of Easter.

Making a Good Examination of Conscience

Each day we should make a good examination of conscience. One should also be made before approaching the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation. I have printed one below that is based on the Ten Commandments.

I. I am the Lord your God, you shall not have false gods before me.

- Have I rejected God's revelation as it comes to me through Scripture and Church teaching?
- Have I served money, power, sexuality, or any other lesser good as if it were supreme.
- Have I despaired of God's help? Have I presumed upon God's mercy?
- Have I placed faith in superstition?

II. You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain.

- Have I disrespected the holiness of God and of things or persons specially associated with God?
- Have I made false oaths or failed to keep vows made in God's sight?

III. You shall keep holy the Sabbath day.

- Have I failed to worship God on Sundays or Holy Days of obligation through my own fault?
- Have I kept Sunday holy by using it as a time for recreation and family, as a day of charitable activity and by making extra time for prayer? Have I rested sufficiently to renew me for the new week?
- Do I pray regularly and attentively through the week?

IV. You shall honor your father and your mother.

- Have I fulfilled obligations toward my parents, especially in their advancing years?
- Have I been respectfully obedient to those who are legitimate authorities in my life?

V. You shall not kill.

- Have I contributed to or concurred in any way with the taking of human life through abortion, euthanasia, or other threats to human life?
- Have I done damage to another's reputation or well being in any way?
- Have I jeopardized my own well being through the use of alcohol, drugs, or some other self-destructive behavior?
- Have I wished for ill fate to befall another?
- Have I done anything that gives bad example to others that might lead them to fall into sin themselves?

VI. and IX. You shall not commit adultery. You shall not covet your neighbor's spouse.

- Have I engaged in willful sexual intercourse outside of marriage?
- Within marriage, have I engaged in sexual activity without regard for expressing true love for my spouse or without openness to the possibility of receiving the gift of human life?
- Have I been sexually impure with another or myself?
- Has my marriage been celebrated in the Catholic Church or with the permission of the Catholic Church?
- Have I pursued and entertained lustful thoughts?

VII. and X. You shall not steal. You shall not covet your neighbor's goods.

- Have I respected the property of others? Have I taken the goods of another or done damage to them?
- Have I taken the intellectual property of others by taking their ideas without giving credit?
- Have I deprived others of a just wage?
- Have I failed to share my resources with those less fortunate than me?
- Have I been discontent with my own blessings from God and envied those of my neighbor?

VIII. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.

- Have I told serious lies? Have I gossiped?
- Have I disclosed the faults of others without serious reason to do so?

new birth by water and the Holy Spirit, and forgiven our
sins. May God also keep us faithful to our Lord Jesus
Christ for ever and ever.
