A reflection from the Pastor

Peace. There has been so much going on this summer. With the church being painted, my taking on the task of digging out a trench around the church and putting weed barrier and white rock to help with the mowing (thanks men for helping with the rock), to the many things that I thought were going to slow down this summer like office work, I realized they are not. It's just life. I am sure your lives are like this too. As I was praying this week, and looking at the gospel for today, the phrase, "they were like sheep without a shepherd" stood out for me. We can be "like" that a lot, but the reality is, in the midst of all of our busy-ness, God is still there guiding us. To the extent we take his direction we find peace. I have finished rereading a book now about St. John Vianney entitled the Curé D' Ars Today by George William Rutler (Ignatius Press, 1988). One of the lines in the book that speaks to this is: [Rutler is speaking about St. John having a real human face, he had all the flaws of a human being -and yet what made him holy was that he didn't compete with God]: "perfection cannot be like anything, because perfection overwhelms analogy. As a saint, Vianney was not godlike: he was godly. To be godlike would mean that he lacked the capacity for God." This is why I love Rutler's writings. This is a truth that we all know, but do we consider it? As Rutler says: "holiness in not godlike...the nature of God requires something other than godlikeness of his creatures. God does not look like himself...he is himself...The deepest mystery for man [therefore] is not God as perfect circle... but God with a human face." One might say, the face of the One who guides us back when times get too hard and holiness seems too high of a mountain to climb - that is where God meets us.

And so, yes, I long for the day I will be able to sit on my porch and just read a book in the evening. But until that day, I pray that the Good Shepherd guide me in guiding you and that these days of summer are more than
