Peace.

Today we celebrate two apostles, Peter and Paul and their life in Christ. As we hear in today's gospel Jesus is trying to get the pulse on who people say that he is. Peter, quick to respond says: "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." This was Peter's great confession of faith in the Messiah, Jesus the Anointed One of God. This confession of course preceded his own denials of Jesus, but would bring him to his eventual death in the circus of Nero by crucifixion, inverted. Paul, as we hear in today's second reading is speaking about his approaching death in his second letter to Timothy. Paul was also called to profess his belief in Christ by the shedding of his blood. These two apostles show us in a profound way that in order to follow the Lord, we have to be willing to get out of the way and let Him be 'all in all'. As we approach the throne of God's grace; let us pray that we might practice the exercise of the keys, and be reconciled to God and one another.
