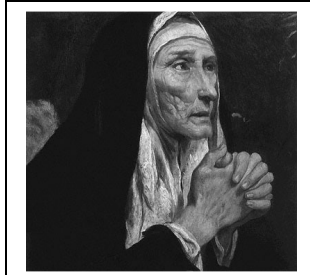


**Prayer for Priests

**Saint of the Week  
Saint Monica**



Born in 322 in Tagaste, North Roman Africa. Raised in a Christian family, she was given in marriage to a bad-tempered, adulterous pagan named Patricius. Mother of two, one of whom is Saint Augustine of Hippo whose writings about her are the primary source of our information about Monica. She prayed constantly for the conversion of her husband (who converted on his death bed), and of her son Augustine (who converted after a wild life at the age of 33 and was baptized). Spiritual student of Saint Ambrose of Milan. Reformed alcoholic. Died in 387 in Ostia, Italy.

St. Monica is the patroness of abuse victims, alcoholics, housewives, widows, mothers, disappointing children, difficult marriages, and victims of verbal abuse.

**A reflection from the Pastor**

Jesus then said to the Twelve, "Do you also want to leave?" Simon Peter answered him, "Master, to whom shall we go?, you have the words of everlasting life," in today's gospel. Remember that Jesus had just told them that unlike their ancestors who ate manna in the desert and died, if they eat his flesh and drink his blood, they will live for ever. Many began to part from Jesus because of this truth and teaching. There is a tendency in our twenty-first century post-modern culture to leave when we hear something that we don't accept, even if it's the Truth. But when it comes to faith and morals, like Peter, we come to realize that there is no other place to go other than Jesus. He has the words of everlasting life. Just this past week a judge in South Dakota ruled that doctors in that state have to tell those choosing abortion that they are killing a human being. Pro-abortionists say that the words 'human being' shouldn't even be mentioned. Again, if it's not convenient, then we can just get on with the sin - in this case the killing of an innocent human life. For those who say the church teaching is too much, I'll go to this or that denomination, statistically they remain unhappy and end up leaving that one too. The answer lies in our faith and how we rely on the Lord to be our strength. To whom shall we go but the Lord. Pray this week that in your own questioning you might find your way to Christ, the Truth.

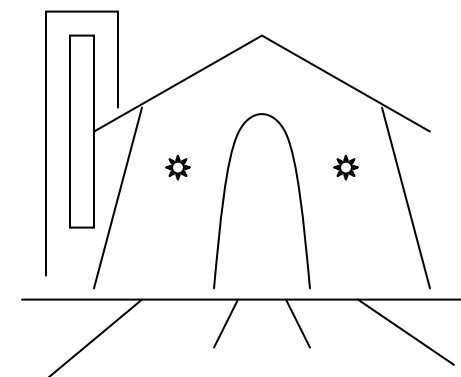
