

A reflection from the Pastor

"Prepare the way of the Lord, may straight his paths," John the Baptist quoting the prophet Isaiah in today's gospel. John was the great forerunner of Jesus; the one who went ahead of him and said: 'get prepared.' Who is the forerunner today, as we look for Jesus' coming? It is the Church, gathered here on earth, which listens to her visible head, the Pope and the teaching magisterium known as the bishops and their co-workers, the priests. When we listen carefully to the word of God and act on it, then we become forerunners of Jesus' return in glory. The key to what John the Baptist quoted, is that we must make straight his paths. This means, that whatever in our lives is twisted by sin, we must set straight; so that it is easier for Jesus to come to us and recognize his life within us. Try this week to straighten the path of Jesus in your life—no matter how windy it may be.

Holy Day of Obligation

Tuesday, December 8, 2009, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary is a holy day of obligation for all Catholics. Mass times will be:

Vigil: 6:00 p.m. Monday December 7

Day: 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. December 8th

On this day we celebrate the fact that Mary was conceived without the stain (macula) of original sin. This was declared a dogma of the faith, December 8, 1854 by Pope Pius IX and has been celebrated as a universal feast since 1476 by Pope Sixtus IV.

A Brief History

In 1531 a "Lady from Heaven" appeared to Juan Diego at Tepeyac. She identified herself as the ever virgin Holy Mary, Mother of the True God for whom we live, of the Creator of all things, Lord of heaven and the earth. She asked a church to be built on the site, and submitted her wish to the local Bishop. When the Bishop hesitated, and requested her for a sign, the Mother of God obeyed without delay or question, sending Her native messenger to the top of the hill in mid-December to gather an assortment of roses for the Bishop.

After complying to the Bishop's request for a sign, She also left for us an image of herself imprinted miraculously on the native's *tilma*, a poor quality cactus-cloth, which should have deteriorated in 20 years but shows no sign of decay 475 years later and still defies all scientific explanations of its origin. According to scientists who have inspected her eyes, in *both of them* and in the precise location as reflected by a *live human eye*, could be seen many figures that have been extensively analyzed and seem to correspond to the shape and size of human figures located in front of the image.
