St. Valentine

Valentine, a priest in Rome (d. 270), assisted the martyrs in the persecution under Claudius II. He was apprehended, and ordered to be beaten with clubs, imprisoned, and beheaded on Feb. 14; because he would not renounce the faith. It is said that he was beheaded because he continued to marry young couples even though Claudius forbade it. Apparently Claudius thought that married soldiers weren't as good as single soldiers.

To baptize, you must be a registered parishioner for at least four months and attending Mass. If from another parish (immediate family [i.e., parents or grandparents] are active parishioners) you must provide a letter from your pastor stating you are active and you must attend your parish's baptismal class. Baptisms are held the first Sunday of each month except during the seasons of Advent and Lent.
