

A reflection from the Pastor

"Come and you will see," Jesus in today's gospel to the first disciples. Imagine someone who did things you could not imagine, someone who spoke another language of suffering, death and resurrection, someone who cured the sick and cast out demons. Now imagine becoming a follower. You would have to change radically, let alone have people around you change what they thought of you.

That was the life of Jesus and the early disciples, and in many ways our life today. We are called to follow Jesus through his life and death and resurrection, by our life, death, and hopeful resurrection. Jesus requires a total surrender and denial of self and following him. This is the life to which we have been called. Let us pray in this week that we might not only have the imagination to think it, but that we might have the hands, feet, and heart to live it.
