## A reflection from the **Pastor**

"...but we proclaim Christ crucified," St. Paul writes in his first letter to the Corinthians. As St. Paul states, this is a stumbling block to many, including those who see Jesus as just another man who died on a cross, an otherwise routine instrument of death in that day. Paul's point goes deeper into the mystery of Jesus being the anointed one, the Messiah, the Christ. This is the one we proclaim crucified, the one who could raise himself by who he was as God; the anointed one whose blood poured out would anoint the world for salvation. Take some time to think about how you proclaim Christ crucified in your own life, in your own body. Lenten denials and sacrifices aren't just about our body, but about us receiving the status of heaven to be with the Christ for ever.

Thank you to all who have been so responsive to the Lenten hot meal effort. The volunteers have been most generous in extending this work of mercy. Our numbers are increasing, and the feeding of the religious education children in the evening has also received good numbers.
