Holy Day of Obligation

Tuesday, December 8, 2009, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary is a holy day of obligation for all Catholics. Mass times will be:

**Vigil: 6:00 p.m. Monday December 7**

**Day: 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. December 8<sup>th</sup>**

*On this day we celebrate the fact that Mary was conceived without the stain (macula) of original sin. This was declared a dogma of the faith, December 8, 1854 by Pope Pius IX and has been celebrated as a universal feast since 1476 by Pope Sixtus IV.*

### *A Brief History*

In 1531 a "Lady from Heaven" appeared to Juan Diego at Tepeyac. She identified herself as the ever virgin Holy Mary, Mother of the True God for whom we live, of the Creator of all things, Lord of heaven and the earth. She asked a church to be built on the site, and submitted her wish to the local Bishop. When the Bishop hesitated, and requested her for a sign, the Mother of God obeyed without delay or question, sending Her native messenger to the top of the hill in mid-December to gather an assortment of roses for the Bishop.

After complying to the Bishop's request for a sign, She also left for us an image of herself imprinted miraculously on the native's *tilma*, a poor quality cactus-cloth, which should have deteriorated in 20 years but shows no sign of decay 475 years later and still defies all scientific explanations of its origin. According to scientists who have inspected her eyes, in *both of them* and in the precise location as reflected by a *live human eye*, could be seen many figures that have been extensively analyzed and seem to correspond to the shape and size of human figures located in front of the image.
