

A reflection from the Pastor

Christ is Risen! Alleluia. Alleluia.

He is Risen Indeed, Alleluia! Alleluia!

"They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him," Mary of Magdala in today's gospel. Can you imagine the shock of Mary when she went to the tomb and didn't find it sealed, and then didn't find Jesus' body there? Simon Peter and the beloved disciple, John, ran to the tomb, also in disbelief – possibly more in disbelief of the resurrection. The gospel tells us that they really didn't know what the resurrection meant at that point. Indeed, they probably were still fearing for their own lives. But, as the action of the resurrection played on their minds and hearts, they began to replay everything Jesus had said and done for them. We sometimes can forget about this action of Jesus – raising his own body – if we simply reduce Easter to just another event that happened. But this is THE event of our existence, for it promises us that our mortal bodies will also rise to the Glory of the Father, if we also are willing to die and rise with the Lord. There is great cause of rejoicing this Easter day, let us proclaim by our very existence that Jesus has been raised, Alleluia, Alleluia.

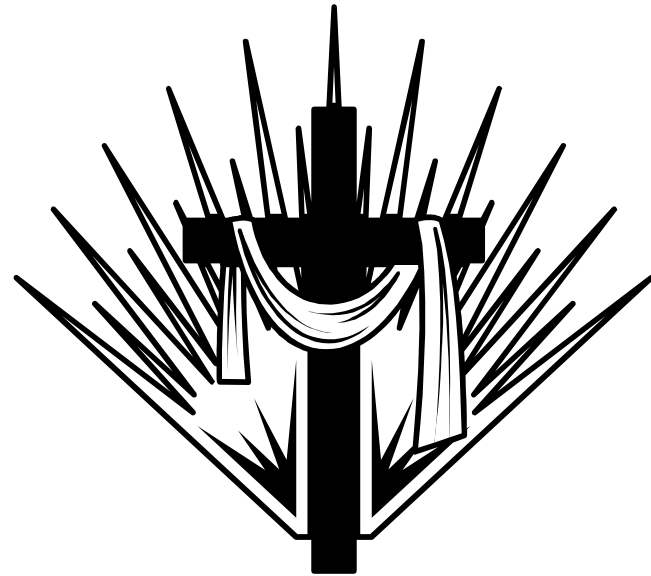
