Aug. 23-Saint Rose of Lima, Virgin

Rose was born in Lima, Peru, in 1586. She began to cultivate the virtues while still a home. Once she put on the habit of the Third Order of Saint Dominic, she made very special progress in the way of penance and mystical contemplation under death on August 24, 1617. She is the first canonized saint of the Americas.

Aug. 24-Saint Bartholomew, Apostle

Bartholomew was born at Cana in Galilee; he was led to Jesus by Philip the Apostle. After the Lord's ascension, he is supposed to have preached the gospel in India and to have been crowned with martyrdom there.

Aug. 25-Saint Louis

Louis was born in 1214 and became king of France at the age of twenty-two. He married and had eleven children, whom he raised in the best possible way. His spirit of penance and prayer, together with his love of the poor, was quite conspicuous. In ruling his kingdom he aimed less for the temporal peace and good of his subjects than for their spiritual profit. He undertook crusades to liberate the sepulcher of Christ and died near Carthage in 1270.

Aug. 25-Saint Joseph Calasanz, Priest

Joseph was born in Aragon in 1557. He received a good education, was ordained a priest, and exercised ministry in his native land. He then devoted himself to teaching poor boys at Rome and founded a society of that purpose. He had much to endure, including the calumnies of the envious. He died at Rome in 1648.

Aug. 27-Saint Monica

Monica was born at Thagaste in North Africa in 331. Her parents arranged her marriage to Patricius; while he was good to her, he was unfaithful, but converted before his death. Their oldest child was Augustine. For the conversion of Augustine, Monica offered many prayers and virtue. She died at Ostia in 387.

Aug. 28-Saint Augustine, Bishop and Doctor of the Church

Augustine was born at Thagaste in Africa in 354. In his early years he led a licentious life and moved restlessly from creed to creed, until he was converted at Milan and baptized by Bishop Saint Ambrose in 387. Returning to his native land, he took up the ascetical life, was made bishop of Hippo, and guided the flock there for thirty-four years. In sermons and copious writings he instructed the people, struggled against the errors of his day, and explained the faith. He died in 430.
