Saints of the Week

September 3 – Gregory the Great – pope and doctor
Born in Rome around 540, Gregory was a senator and civic administrator who at age 35 entered the Benedictine monastery. After five years he was legate to Constantinople and on this date in 590 became Pope. For 14 years he worked in incomparable fashion - guiding the Church in decadent times, facing the Lombard invasions, sending out missionaries, writing, advancing the liturgy. Gregorian chant is named for him. One of the greatest Popes in centuries, equal to the crisis of his age, Gregory the Great died in 604.



To Know is to Grow: What is a doctor of the church? This is a very special title accorded by the Church to certain saints. This title indicates that the writings and preaching's of such a person are useful to Christians "in any age of the Church." Such men and women are also particularly known for the depth of understanding and the orthodoxy of their theological teachings. While the writings of the Doctors are often considered inspired by the Holy Spirit, this does not mean they are infallible, but it does mean that they contributed significantly to the formulation of Christian teaching in at least one area.
