

A reflection from the Pastor

In today's gospel, Jesus enters the synagogue and reads from the scroll of the prophet Isaiah in what is known as his inaugural sermon. It was the beginning of his preaching about why he came: "to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord." In a very simple and humble way, he made known that he was going to be about service, and not just any kind of service, but the kind that wasn't readily available – a liberating service for body and soul, a year of favor. We are already into our new year and we probably have made some resolutions by now on how we want to serve the Lord. Are we staying the course? If not, let this sermon be a recharging of that mission. As St. Paul says in the second reading, though individual parts, we are all one body in Christ. Let us pray this week that we might realize this reality in our service of one another.

The priest retreat was good. The retreat master, Fr. Don Halpin, a Franciscan, led us and was very enlightening. Thank you for your prayers and support during this past week. Of course, the last day of the retreat we learned of the vandalism at Holy Family Church in Victoria. 30 Pre-Baptism Instruction 10-12 Heritage
*To baptize, you must live within the parish boundary and should be attending Mass. If from another parish (immediate family [i.e., parents or grandparents] are active parishioners) you must provide a letter from your pastor stating you are active and you must attend your parish's baptismal class. Baptisms are held the first Sunday of each month except during the seasons of Advent and Lent.
Birth certificate of child is required before baptism.*
