## Saints of the Week

Nov. 15-St. Albert the Great, bishop and doctor From 1245 to 1248 a Bavarian Dominican who had studied at Padua, Albert, taught at Paris. His most attentive student concerning Aristotelian philosophy was Thomas Aquinas of the same Dominican Order. Albert went to Cologne- followed by Thomas. Albert became Provincial and then Bishop of Ratisbon-but after two years returned to teaching. A profound and holy professor, he died at Cologne in 1280, aged over 70. Albert was canonized a saint in 1931. A doctor-teacher of the Church, he is patron of scientists and philosophers.

Nov. 16-St. Margaret of Scotland Today's saint was born in Hungary around 1046 while her father was in political exile from William the Conqueror. The family returned to England and then Scotland, where Margaret married King Malcolm in 1070. Margaret was an ideal queen-devoted to her illiterate husband and eight children, concerned for charity and religion, helping the poor people of Scotland. She died at Edinburgh in 1093, four days after Malcolm had been killed.

Nov. 17-St. Elizabeth of Hungary, religious Born in Hungary in 1207, Elizabeth at 14 was married to Ludwig IV of Thuringia. For the intense Elizabeth it was a happy marriage. The family tried to follow the ideals of Francis of Assisi, then living. As she was expecting their third child Ludwig died in the Crusades. Elizabeth became a Franciscan tertiary, founded a hospital in honor of St. Francis, and gave herself totally to care for the poor. She died in 1231, age only 24, at Marburg. St. Elizabeth is Patroness of the Franciscan Third Order and of Catholic charities.
