Saints of the Week

February 8

St. Jerome Emiliani



Born in Venice in 1486, Jerome became a soldier but left the service to devote himself to helping the poor, even to the extent of distributing his own property to them. He founded the Order of Clerics Regular of Somascha. He died at Somascha in the territory of Bergame in 1537.

Saint Josephine Bakhita, Virgin



Josephine was a young Sudanese girl sold into slavery and brought to Italy where, while serving as a nanny, she was sent to live with the Canossian Sisters of the Institute of the Catechumens in Venice. There she was baptized, and, having reached maturity age, was granted her freedom by Italian law. In 1896, she joined the Canossian Daughters of Charity where she served humbly for the next twenty five years. She died after a long and painful illness.

Saint Scholastica, Virgin



Today's saint was the twin sister of Benedict, founder of the Benedictine Order. She lived in a century and country full of difficulties – during the 6th Century in central Italy, when armies of Goths and Byzantines criss-crossed the land and repeatedly terrorized the people. Scholastica demonstrated her holiness, peace and strength. Rivaling her brother in holiness, Scholastica died in 547.
