## Saints of the Week



**January 4**

**St. Elizabeth Ann Seton**

Catholics of the United States of America are honored by today's saint. Born in New York City in 1774, she was an Episcopalian and a socialite who attended President Washington's inauguration. After her husband's death - by whom she had five children - Elizabeth Seton became a Catholic. In 1809 she started a religious teaching community, the first American Sisters of Charity, and began the Catholic school, system. This heroic woman died in 1821 and was canonized a saint on September 14, 1975.



**January 5**

**St. John Neumann, bishop**

The United States is likewise honored by today's Saint John Neumann, who was born (1811) in Bohemia and came to the missions of the United States. He was ordained as a diocesan priest and later joined the Redemptorists. In 1852 he was made Bishop of Philadelphia. A holy, untiring worker during times of Nativist bigotry and the difficult Catholic growth, he died in 1860 and canonized in 1977.
