September 17th,
St. Robert Bellarmine,
Bishop and Doctor

Robert Bellarmine exemplifies an important aspect of the Society of Jesus: intellectual service to the Church. Today's saint, born in Italy (1542), entered the Jesuits at age 18. He taught theology at Louvain and Rome, developed the theological basis for the Catholic Reformation, became a pastoral Bishop and Cardinal. His influence on Catholic intellectual life and the Gregorian University in Rome has been extensive. Robert Bellarmine died on September 17, 1621. His canonization process lasted 300 years. Robert Bellarmine was declared a saint and Doctor (teacher) of the Church in 1930.

St. Matthew,
Apostle and Evangelist

With gratitude we celebrate today the Apostle-writer of the first Gospel. Born at Capernaum and given the name Levi, when called by Jesus he was a tax collector or publican. Tradition holds that he wrote the Gospel in Aramaic. We possess only the canonical Greek Gospel of Matthew, the carefully structured favorite Christian Gospel.
