Saints of the Week



October 1st,
St. Theresa of the Child Jesus,
Virgin

Today's saint is the popular "Little Flower of Jesus" (1873-1897). Marie Theresa Martin, devout from childhood, by special permission entered the cloistered Carmelites of Lisieux in France at age 15. She developed a spiritual approach of striving for perfection by being called a child of God. At age 24 she died in profoundly spiritual fashion. Her autobiography, The Story of a Soul, helped to make her popular in the following years. She was canonized a saint in 1925.



October 4th,
St. Francis of Assisi,

Called the most Christlike person since Christ, today's remarkable saint (1182-1226) was born of a wealthy family in Assisi, Italy. Gifted with a joyful spirit, Francis renounced his father's wealth to become the Little Poor Man of Assisi. An extraordinary person, he attracted followers (the Franciscans) and by evangelical poverty strengthened the Church. The joyous, poor, simple Franciscan spirit still strengthens the Church. Receiving the stigmata towards the end of life, Francis the deacon died on October 3, 1227. His life says much to modern day men and women.
