Virgin and Martyr

It seems that a noble girl, aged between 13 and 15, took place towards the end of Diocletian's persecution-around 305. Her parents told her, during the persecution, Agnes went to the authorities to proclaim her faith. She was condemned to death-first by burning, then by decapitation. The courage of this youthful heroine has been an inspiration ever since her death. Agnes means "lamb." This meaning has added much to the history of devotion to this young martyr, who is mentioned in the First Eucharistic Prayer.



St. Stephen Deacon & Martyr Patron of Altar Servers

St. Vincent,  
Deacon and Martyr

This saint reminds us of the noble history of deacons in the early church. Diocletian's persecution (300-305) aimed first at purging the military. It then hit at clerics, and finally the laity. In Saragossa, Spain, the deacon Vincent was martyred with his bishop, Valerio. The early Church honored three deacon martyrs from three different nations. They were Stephen (Palestine), Lawrence (Rome) and Vincent (Spain). They were the noble ancestors of our present permanent deacons.
