July 30th,
St. Peter Chrysologus,
Bishop and Doctor

Called Chrysologus (“golden worded”) because of his eloquence, today’s saint was born near Ravenna in Italy around 480. Elected bishop of Ravenna when that Kingdom was at its strongest, Peter I was an effective, dedicated pastoral leader. He preached briefly and preached much. Some 180 of his sermons still exist. They show him to have been a direct, warm, convincing speaker. Bishop Peter I died on a July 30, between 451 and 458.



July 31st,
St. Ignatius of
Loyola,
Priest

Today’s saint, founder of the Jesuits, has since the 16th Century had a profound influence on Catholic history. Born in the Basque area of Spain, at Loyola (1493), Ignatius after being wounded as a soldier found Christ. A strong and holy organizer, Ignatius founded the Society of Jesus along military lines at Paris in 1534. At a critical time the Jesuits were magnificent in resisting Protestantism, reforming the Church, laboring in mission lands and in the educational apostolate. His “Spiritual Exercises” helped many others to conversion. Ignatius, demonstrating manly love for Christ and unconditional loyalty to the Pope, died at Rome on July 3, 1556. He was canonized a saint in 1622.
